SAKAR has been registered under the Societies Registration Act of 1860, bearing the Registration. No. 21582\17 of 2003-2004 issued against KAD REGD NO 7500-468 of 1997-98.

AREA OF OPERATION

SAKAR had started its operation in Bhubaneswar slums. But at present its activities are spread to a number of places across the boundaries of Bhubaneswar, Khordha, Nayagarh, Puri, Ganjam, Dhenkanal districts.

To work towards a society where all children and women have equal opportunities to grow to their full potential.

A quest for an exploitation-free and balanced society based on long cherished human values, social and economic freedom, and justice to one and all with special focus on the all round development of women and children, girl child in particular.

GOALS

- ➤ To integrate the children of the underprivileged sector/community into the mainstream of the society.
- ▶ To rehabilitate marginalized children with necessary guidance, vocational education and related activities.
- ➤ To promote and undertake social services aimed to improve the living conditions and economic standard of the poor and the weaker sections of the society.
- To work towards greater involvement of women in social network. Formation &nurturing of SHGs through entrepreneurship and relevant activities.
- ▶ To make learning as the corner-stone for liberation and social justice by providing need based vocational training to slum/rural children, providing literacy for parents, and undertaking family counseling against atrocities.
- ▶ To promote plantation drive motivation and awareness for environment and campaign for "Green" work towards climate change and global warming.
 - Implementation of Disaster Risk Management to reduce vulnerability of the communities to natural disaster in identified multi hazards prone areas.

- Improving lively hood strategies for mothers and women, SHGs are the main thrust.
- Road safety awareness programs are conducted to create awareness among youth. Good driving habits, usage of helmets, fallow the rules of the Government for personal and others safety while on the roads.
- Go green, plantation in all Schools and its maintained by the schools & in the rural /semi urban areas awareness for plantation is being conducted; usage of used water for the plants is being propagated.
- Yoga being imparted to all age groups extensively

1.Marginalized CHILDRENS EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM:

GOALS

- Preparing a band of active and effective teachers as a bridge for the students to facilitate communication between authorities, parents, Government agencies and social activists.
- Through teachers provide support to children of waste collectors, daily laborers and sex workers who are often discriminated by the general schools and the larger society.
- Early Child hood care centers, Crèches for the children of working and ailing mothers. Planted 20 saplings in each school, in Begunia and BOLGARH blocks.Gopabandhu High School,Begunia,Gediapalli High School, Baman High School Bolgarh,BadaKumari School, Dabardhuva patana School,Pichukuli Nodal highschool,



ACHIEVEMENTS DURING THE YEAR.

- 72 children are able to keep up with the school activities.
- Readmission of school dropouts.
- Fourteen children of different classes from Tarinisahi, Mundasahi Mali sahi, were readmitted in the Govt High School, Gondamunda, NAC colony Primary school, T.B.P.C.U G.U P School, Bhubaneswar.2nd postal colony primary, Pothorobandho, Vani Vihar, Bhubaneswar etc.



The project Computer skill training for under privileged children has been taken up to impart computer education to the 25children.25 children became computer literates.

- Provision of School uniform dresses by inviting corporate sector, special thanks to Individual donors who came forward for this who has been liberal donors for this program.
- 43 rural communities are mobilized to send their children to schools through the cultural programs, on education, health and hygiene. Marginalized children are participated in the plays, songs and other entertainments. These programs are eye openers for the parents/ guardians.
- Wall writings were done with the message of education for all children and rights of the child. In the important places like school boundaries, community walls, public places of people interest. This wall writing has impact on the parents and community.
- SAKAR conducted regular meetings in the communities to make people aware of the Rational use of Medicines and mobilize community to take care of health of their people.



Sakar has been helping women in earning their lively hood. The cases
of some women are highlighted in this regard. They not only earn for
themselves by making Imitation Jewellery they even employed others
with them. They are able to earn Rs 150/- to Rs250/- per day.

Institutional Capacities Built.

- Providing vocational training and linking the poor to sources of financial capital makes more opportunities available to the poor people. SAKAR has steady progress in acquiring institutional capacities to change the lives of the poor.
- Spotting talents fitting the vocation to the person and putting in the right word has since become routine for SAKAR.

IMPROVING GENDER RELATIONS

GOALS

- Helping women to break gender barriers by making use of the many opportunities provided by institutions and Govt schemes.
- Ensuring timely and accessible justice for the poor people, especially women for legal awareness, consumer awareness.
- Fact finding and documenting the violation of the socio economic and political rights of the people in general. Specially domestic workers in semi and urban areas.

Achievements in the year.

SAKAR continued facilitation to women for availing institutional resources. The social milieu created by SAKAR helped women in the fallowing programs.

- Facilitated Birth registration of New born children in the current year.
- Pulse polio program.
- Self Help groups.



- Facilitated conducting environmental awareness Global Warming to the people of Nayagarh, Itamati, Mali sahi i, Bodopandisur villages of Nayagarh distructs, Gollapatana, Bhuinpur, Begunia villages of Khurda district.
- P.C.R.A.Work Shops awareness on the conservation of energy.
- Community meetings are organized by SAKAR once in two months to review the progress of children with regard to education and skill development etc.
- Youth from urban and rural areas participated in the work shops on "How to conserve petroleum products" sponsored by Petroleum Conservation Research Association, under the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas. These workshops caught the attention of High schools/colleges.

Achievements to date

80 Self help group leaders were given skill development training in the Begunia Block to address the women financial and skill problems, to empower them with entrepreneur ship development and better agricultural & horticulture practices. Agriculture workshops were conducted to create awareness among the farmers for better crop yield, in Ganjam district of Orissa.

Self-employment for women.

Around 80self help groups were formed in the Begunia Block. 1386 ladies became members. They started saving in the UCO Bank Begunia.Puri Gramya Bank, Begunia and State Bank of India Khurda Branch. They continue to use the bank linkages, credit and saving habits for earning Rs 50/- to Rs 80/- per day by running small business enterprises.

Institutional Capacities Built:

Sakar has developed and fine-tuned capacities for creating access to women to institutional schemes through the judicious use of group activities.

SOCIAL CAMPAIGNS

Social campaigns are part of the menu to arouse dormant feelings of empathy that is innate to human beings. One cannot imagine initiating and sustaining the many activities of SAKAR with the masala and the verve that these campaigns create in the lives of ordinary women. Often times the cause is immaterial, as idea in one-campaign blends into other related fields. It is day of for the poor that would ease the daily grind of very serious lively hood occupations. Once the idea gains momentum, it gains life of its own.

- Teacher's day was observed by SAKAR on September 5TH 2023 in the two SAKAR early childhood care cum Bridge centers. Debate competitions were conducted; children spoke about the Teachers day. Teachers were facilitated and prizes were distributed to the children.

Observed the Children's day on 14 th November 2023. Hand writing competition was conducted at Mundasahi, Bhubaneswar and second postal colony Primary School, Vani vihar, sweet packets were distributed to all children.

,Awareness has been created on "Diabetics can be reverted" with Yoga and change of dietary habits.



Observed the International day for the persons with disabilities on 2nd
December 2023 at Vocational Rehabilitation Center for the Handicapped at
SIRD phokiriput Bhubaneswar, differently able children from rural places and
